

SUMMER FELLOWSHIP OPPORTUNITY

POSITION OVERVIEW

D&R Greenway Land Trust and Tulpehaking Nature Center are seeking a **Delaware River Watershed Fellow** to engage our watershed community, emphasizing the importance of watershed stewardship and helping reach new audiences. No prior experience or knowledge in watershed issues is necessary.

QUALIFICATIONS & EXPERIENCE

Note: Spanish speakers are strongly encouraged to apply.

Candidates must be:

- 18 years of age by the June start date
- Available Tuesday-Saturday
- People-oriented, self-motivated, and able to work as a member of a team
- Able to lead hikes through varied terrain
- Comfortable using computer software such as Microsoft Word, PowerPoint and Excel

CAPSTONE PROJECT

The Fellow will be part of a cohort of 30+ other Fellows across 23 environmental centers in the Delaware River Watershed. Each Fellow will develop and carry out an independent Capstone project over the course of the 12-week position. The results of these projects will be presented at the end of the season Watershed Fellowship Summit.

RESPONSIBILITIES

The Fellow will split their time between the **Tulpehaking Nature Center (TNC)** and **D&R Greenway Land Trust (DRG)**. At the TNC, the Fellow will assist with community outreach and nature education programs such as guided walks and family activities. At DRG, the Fellow will assist with an educational kayak program and help to curate exhibits at Point Breeze, the former estate of Joseph Bonaparte, located in Bordentown, NJ.

TIMELINE & COMPENSATION

- June 6: Fellowship Start Date
- June 15-17: Virtual Fellow Orientation
- August 19: Watershed Fellowship Summit
- August 26: Fellowship End Date

The position pays \$15.50 per hour and the Fellow will work 35 hours per week.
